- (a) Newly appointed Coaches Don Masters (Div.1) and Danny Dunn (Div. II) who were introduced to the Members expressed their pleasure in being associated with the Club and that they looked forward to the coming season. The retiring Div. 1 Coach, C. Guerriero, urged all Players and Members to assist the Coached in every way possible.

There being no further business brought forward, the President thanked those in attendance for their participation and closed the meeting at 10.15p.m.

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PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

In the first Smoke Signals for 1980/81 I stated that this year was to be a year of challenge in all areas of the Club - and I am happy to say that we took this challenge head on and under the circumstances we had a good year.

The Administration side of the club worked exceedingly well and in harmony and for the first time for many years had the responsibility of having to organise the clubrooms along with canteen and kitchen facilities. We have the use of one of the best facilities in S.A. Baseball circles and we now have to make them work for us which is no easy job and will be the major jobs for the coming season to ensure its success.

A lot of Don's time was spent in learning players personalities and getting them to change their attitudes to fit into a successful unit, this he achieved and it is now the situation that top clubs are approaching matches with Goodwood in a much more serious vein than they have in the past. I am sure that given the even breaks we will only improve further next season if we build on the foundations laid out by Don this past season.

Fund Raising is a very important aspect of any club and our Social Committee done an extremely good job and have already laid down a number of recommendations to the incoming committee with regards to functions for next season. Please continue to support them where possible and I can assure you that you will benefit in the long run.

The Smoke Signals is providing members with an insight into the Clubs activities and is also a venue for members to voice their opinions as to how the club should be run - this is great but I feel that it could be more constructive if people who write such articles were to come forward and serve the Club by taking a hand in the administration of the Club.

On this point I would like to point out that nominations for coaches already called for this season has only attracted 3 nominations and will be advertised again along with several other departments in the next Smoke Signals.

One of the most successful events and a very important one at that, was the Players and Officials Reunion, a lot of work went into this occasion and thanks must go to Bert Haynes for his untiring efforts and organisation - THANKS BERT.
